## **Death Impacts Firefighter Community**



In January the fire service lost a former Fireman, 37-year-old Jeremy Quimby, Jeremy was a husband and a father of three young children.

I was the chaplain on the call when he passed and had the honor of attending his funeral in early February. Jeremy originally worked for McMinnville Fire, then Lake Oswego Fire. He recently left the fire service to run his own company, Quimby Construction. As the new McMinnville Police and Fire chaplain, I was requested to participate in a Critical Management Briefing for McMinnville Fire because of Jeremy's years of past service for them. The following three days I attended Peer Support meetings with all three shifts to insure the well-being of the firefighters.

## Gresham Fire Fighter Line of Duty Death

In February I had the honor of assisting with the funeral for the line-of-duty death of Gresham Fire Fighter, Brandon Norbury. He tragically went into cardiac arrest during a training exercise and his department went to work trying to revive him, he was transported to the hospital and later pronounced dead. Brandon had served honorably for 8 years as a Navy Seal, 7 years in the Gresham Police Department, and 15 as a Gresham Firefighter.

As the Oregon Fire Chiefs Association Chaplain, I responded and made myself available to the chief and acted as a liaison for the Oregon Fire Service Honor Guard. I attended the funeral service with Dundee Fire. I hope you will join us in lifting up Brandon's loved ones in prayer as they grieve this immense loss.
